#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course will provide a comprehensive understanding of vector drawing with Adobe Illustrator. Students will learn to create, edit and transform vector objects and apply them in several industry standard multimedia communication contexts. There will also be a focus on how to convert artwork, drawings and bitmap images into editable, vector formats.

#### **COURSE FORMAT**

## Weekly breakdown of instructional hours

Classes run once a week for 3 hours. Students are expected to arrive before class begins to log-in to their computer workstation and prepare for class.

Most class modules include an assignment used to reinforce and understand the practical application of the concepts covered. Students should expect up to 4 additional hours of time outside of class each week for completing assignments.

## **Delivery format**

Classes are delivered face-to-face in the Multimedia lab (room T1030) at YukonU's Ayamadigut campus in Whitehorse.

Conventional lecture and demonstration methods are used to present the theory portion while hands-on demonstrations, projects and assignments are utilized to reinforce and compliment the theory.

During class time the instructor will introduce tools and concepts which will then be applied through instructor-led, hands-on software lessons. This will be supplemented by independent, self-directed exercises and assignments. Some class time will be allotted for working on assignments.
